# Step 1

First, find a local FFL (we have a search page below) that will take care of the background check process and confirm they are willing to process transfers for online purchases (not all FFL's will do this for various reasons, so it's best to confirm on their website or by calling them).

Confirming that the FFL will accept the transfer is *EXTREMELY* important, and often overlooked. If a firearm is shipped to an FFL that will not complete the transfer, you are responsible for any costs associated with either having the firearm shipped to a different FFL, or returned to us for a 20% restocking fee.

## Step 2

Purchase your firearm, and we ship it to the FFL

If you are purchasing a firearm with a higher capacity magazine than your state allows, and the firearm is marked as 'Restricted Capacity Available', we will replace any magazines that are not legal in your state with the same number of magazines based on what is available at the time of purchase, or permanently modify the included magazine(s) to meet your state capacity requirements. This will likely add additional shipping time to your order.

### Step 3

Once your firearm arrives, visit the FFL to complete any required paperwork and pay the transfer fee.

Also, carefully inspect your firearm, making sure it's the correct product and that the serial number matches the paperwork you're completing. Once the transfer is completed you CANNOT return the firearm. More information on returns is <u>here</u>.

You can then either take your firearm home, or;

#### Step 3.1

For states with a waiting period, wait until you're given the all clear from the FFL, then return to collect your firearm and enjoy happy, and safe, shooting!

### **Federal Firearms Licensee Search**

If you need to find an FFL you can try searching through https://www.gunbroker.com/ffl/index or https://fflgundealers.net/. Please note we are not affiliated with either site.

Please note that just because an FFL is listed in the search engine does NOT mean they are willing to process transfers for online purchases. It's important that you confirm that they will process your transfer before purchasing your firearm.

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

What happens if the background check does not pass?

If for some reason there is an issue with the background check then we treat this as a <u>Return</u>. This may mean a 20% restocking fee for items that are open, and to recover the costs of shipping.

We cannot change the name of the purchaser of the firearm once an order is submitted, as this can be considered a straw purchase.

Can I order multiple items and have some go to the FFL, and some to my house?
